

# How to Collect a Stool Sample for an Ova and Parasite Test

Instructions for Patients

Your doctor has asked you to collect a sample of your stool (poo). We will test this sample for parasites. The results will help your doctor to determine if you have an infection in your digestive tract.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN	
□ R	Read ALL the instructions carefully.
_ с	<b>WEEK BEFORE collection, STOP</b> ALL medicines, laxatives, enemas, anti-diarrheal drugs that ontain barium, mineral oil, or magnesium, or antibiotics, if possible, unless otherwise directed by our doctor. You may restart taking these once you finished collecting your sample.
How o	do I collect a stool sample?
STEP	1. Gather your supplies in the bathroom, within easy reach.
	The <b>sterile specimen container</b> that we gave to you. The container has a plastic spoon attached to the lid.
•	• If the specimen container does not have a label with your name on it, clearly print your full legal name (first and last) and your date of birth. Then print the date and time of the collection.
	Caution: This container has a liquid preservative called "SAF Fixative". This SAF liquid is poisonous and contains small amounts of formaldehyde and acetic acid.
	DO NOT remove the liquid from the container.
	DO NOT drink the liquid.
	Keep the container upright to prevent it from spilling.
	Avoid prolonged contact with skin.
	KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN.
	<ul> <li>Keep the container upright to prevent it from spilling.</li> <li>Avoid prolonged contact with skin.</li> </ul>

**STEP 2.** Wash your hands with soap and water. Dry thoroughly.

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#### How do I collect a stool sample? (continued)

### **STEP 3.** Catch your stool.

It is important that your stool sample does not touch toilet water or urine (pee). If needed, first pee into the toilet and flush.

To catch your stool before it goes into the toilet, you can either:

- Hold a clean dry disposable container under your bum, OR
- Place plastic wrap over the toilet bowl rim. Put the seat down to help hold the plastic wrap in place.

## **STEP 4.** Collect your stool sample.

- A. Unscrew the lid of the specimen container. Use the plastic spoon attached to the lid to transfer 2 to 3 spoonfuls of stool into the SAF liquid until the liquid reaches the **full line**. **DO NOT OVERFILL**.
  - Make sure you do this step within 30 minutes of your bowel movement.
  - If present, scoop out samples of stool that contain mucous or blood.
- B. Use the spoon to break up the stool pieces in the SAF liquid as much as possible.
- C. Replace the lid and tighten firmly to prevent leaking.
- D. Gently shake the container until the stool sample is well mixed with the liquid.
- E. For sanitary reasons, place the specimen container in a sealed plastic bag. You may store your sample at room temperature.

#### **STEP 5.** Flush the toilet.

Flush the remainder of the stool down the toilet. Put the plastic spoon, disposable container, and/or plastic wrap in a disposable bag and throw it in the garbage.

## **STEP 6.** Wash your hands with soap and water. Dry thoroughly.

## **STEP 7.** Return your sample.

Return the stool sample **as soon as possible** to **HRH's Ambulatory Clinic Laboratory.** We are located on level 1 of the hospital, across from the Central Elevators. We are open Monday to Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

## When will I receive my results?

A report will be sent to Public Health and your doctor within 5 to 10 days.

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
