Retirement Homes

Retirement homes are privately owned. They rent private accommodation to seniors who can live with little or no outside help. Retirement homes do not provide 24-hour nursing care. The government does not fund retirement homes and you will need to cover the full cost of your own housing and care (ranges from \$1500 to \$10,000 per month).

You can expect to live much more independently here than you would in a long-term care home or supportive housing
