We also offer two \$1500 scholarships to grade 12 students who are children of HRH staff members. Interviews via Zoom were held in May. The scholarship winners were recognized at the AGM in June. After we made out selection, three of our recipients were recognized by their school boards for academic excellence.

William Mazin is a student volunteer who completed 176 hours of volunteering. He will be working at the Hospital for Sick Children this summer in a research lab. He is enrolled at Queen's in the Bachelor of Science program and plans to become a research doctor.
