There were many old and new faces helping with the Sunday set-up (Norma, Maureen, Tanya, Harimo, Casho, Doreen, Joan, Pauline, Lan, Kim, Lorraine, Amina and Dalal) but we owe a large debt of gratitude to Pauline Kishimoto's family and one of their friends (Daniel, David, Fay and Frank) who single handedly unloaded all the boxes from the truck. Many of the Sunday volunteers also helped during the three day sale and also Fidel, Erane, Marianne, Alma, Joyce, Karen, Liz, Shanti, and Teresa (who came with a friend to buy shoes and stayed for two hours on Wednesday afternoon to help tape boxes). It takes a village! As usual, the sale ended at 12 noon on Wednesday and a willing group of co-op students arrived to help with packing up the remaining shoes.
